Take a lofty drive up to 6,800-foot Pleasant Creek Ranch for spectacular views of Utah's Sanpete Valley and the surrounding mountains and forests. Miles away from the bustle of city life, this 25-acre Coast Premier Resort lets you breathe in the crisp, clear mountain air and leave your cares behind.

Pleasant Creek's managers, Carma and Mel Davidson, are eager to welcome you to this private paradise and

show you around. Accommodations range from full-hookup RV campsites to a furnished rental cabin that sleeps up to 12 people in comfort.

The lodge meets guests' every need with rest rooms, showers, a laundry room, a general store and activity areas for bingo and crafts. You'll also find a game room, a TV and a snack bar.

Start winding down with a refreshing dip in the outdoor pool, then kick



back in the picnic pavilion with an al-fresco meal. When you're ready for more activity, head to the playground, the horseshoe pits or the basketball and volleyball courts.

Pleasant Creek and the historic town of Mount Pleasant are gateways to recreational activities throughout the Manti-La Sal National Forest. Extensive ATV trails take off from Skyline Drive. Nearby lakes and streams offer trout fishing at its finest, and thousands of wooded acres allow big-game hunting.

Central Utah has so many scenic byways, public parks and recreational areas, you'll wonder what to see and do first. A great place to begin is the breathtaking Nebo Loop Scenic Byway that winds through the sandstone cliffs and colorful red-rock formations of the Wasatch Range.
