

CAMPERWORLD—LAKESIDE PARK

In the 1800s and early 1900s, life was so hard for homesteaders and mountain men around Duchesne, Utah, they nicknamed the area Starvation. These days it's quite the reverse with Duchesne and the Uinta Basin and Mountains serving up a feast of scenic vistas and recreational possibilities. And for Coast to Coast members, Camperworld—Lakeside Park is the main course.

One of two Camperworld resorts in the Coast to Coast network, this Coast Premier property stretches alongside 3,495-acre Starvation Reservoir, which despite its name is a banquet of blue waters surrounded by gray-green sagebrush and dramatic red shale hillsides. If you own any kind of watercraft, be sure to bring it. Lakeside Park has both launching and docking access, and also offers canoes. And don't forget your fishing gear. If you're lucky, you'll be dining on walleye, trout, smallmouth bass, Utah chub or yellow perch.

On the property, you'll find a kids' playground, a picnic pavilion and a game room, along with nice restrooms and showers. Plug into full hookups at your spacious campsite, some of which have pull-through access, then stock up on soda, bagged ice and firewood down at the main building. Pets are welcome here, but check with the office about restrictions before making reservations.

Native stands of cottonwood trees and willows grow along the banks of the Strawberry and Duchesne rivers, which convene in the nearby town of Duchesne. Thirty miles to the north, the High Uintas Wilderness tempts hikers to the highest summits in the state, including 13,520-foot Kings Peak.
