If you have always wanted to go to the Bavarian Alps, you don't have to save for a European vacation. Just jump in your rig and head to Helen, Georgia, and Unicoi Springs Camp Resort. Helen's a recreated alpine village complete with cobblestone alleys and old-world towers, with the North Georgia mountains as the perfect setting. Three miles from Helen is the lovely Unicoi Springs Camp Resort that uses the rolling terrain to its advantage. Unicoi Springs' campsites offer a full spectrum of lakeside, lake overlook, shade or sunshine, close in to the Clubhouse or far enough to give you a small hike if you wish.

The scenery may make you think you're all alone in the mountains, but you're far from "roughing" it. Through the gated entrance you'll drive on paved roads throughout the park. All sites feature level paved pads with patio or deck and picnic table, water, electric, sewer, and cable. Enjoy two swimming pools, basketball, volleyball, tennis, badminton, mini-golf, shuffleboard, horseshoes, and billiards. Bring your fishing gear and access the beautiful lake.

The beautiful 2-story log Clubhouse and a separate Activity Building with a full kitchen offer internet access and many planned activities to keep you busy, help you meet new friends and renew old friendships.

Feel peace of mind with the security team that's on duty from 4 p.m. until 8 a.m. daily.

Nearby activities include hot air balloon races, Oktoberfest, trout tournament, and volksmarch held annually in Helen. The nearby Chattahoochee, Nantahala, Etowah, and Chestee rivers are perfect for canoeing, white-water rafting, tubing, and kayaking. If you're into waterfalls, visit nearby Amicalola Falls, Ruby Falls, Dukes Creek Falls, and Tallulah Falls and Gorge. Hike a piece of the Appalachian Trail and visit Brasstown Bald, the highest point in Georgia.
