

The lure of a desert lake draws visitors

If your idea of being in the desert is sand, sand, and more sand, then head your rig to Lake Havasu, Arizona, and discover this gorgeous resort set alongside what can only be referred to as an oasis. Lake Havasu is a fishing paradise and stretches more than 29 miles from "the sand bar" in the north to Parker Dam in the south. Striped bass and channel catfish are abundant, but you can also catch smallmouth bass, bluegill, and stripers.
