

Washington State camping at its best

Washington State is known for its gorgeous Pacific Ocean coastline and breathtaking mountains, and Travel Inn Resort offers you the best of both worlds. The resort is strategically located at the gateway to ocean and mountain recreation—30 minutes from coastal beaches.

Nearby you can access other sporting opportunities such as bowling, golf, paintball, hiking, biking, and motorbiking.

A short drive away, visit Capitol State Forest for an adventure horseback ride at Mima Falls, spotting salmon in McLane Creek, mountain biking at Rock Candy, and off-roading at Porter Creek.

At Lake Sylvia, hikers come from all around southwest Washington to cover the

year-round, 5-mile loop trail, which rolls gently from the campground, over wetlands and a small covered bridge. A walk around the lake reveals a dam that provided hydroelectric power to the logging camp in the early 1900s. Park trails connect to a network of hiking and biking trails in the surrounding 5,000-acre Montesano City Forest.

In nearby Westport, Washington, find miles and miles of beautiful public access beach. The southern portion of the beach can be driven on. Make sure to bring your camera.
