

A stay at Maple Grove Resort is far from roughing it

With Mount Rainier, Mount St. Helens, and Mount Adams forming a triangle around Maple Grove Resort, adventure is never very far away. And with amenities like a 9-hole golf course, this isn't your typical Washington camping. The nearby mountains provide opportunities to participate in all high-terrain sports, particularly snow skiing, cross-country skiing, and snow shoeing. There are many hiking, ATVing, horseback riding, and biking trails, too.

Amenities onsite at the resort include an indoor pool and hot tub, basketball, volleyball, horseshoes, and a playground. An adult clubhouse adds to your visit. Enjoy the water? Maple Grove is located on 896 feet of the

Cowlitz River near Randle. The river starts at Mount Rainier and runs through the Cascade Range ultimately dumping into the Columbia River, which empties into the Pacific Ocean. The area has an abundance of wildlife including deer, bald eagles, osprey, and blue heron. In

addition, there are more than 60 lakes within 40 miles of the resort.

Located nearby in southwest Washington, the Gifford Pinchot National Forest encompasses 1,368,300 acres of forests, mountains, river valleys, waterfalls, wildernesses, and volcanoes. The forest has three main geographic areas to visit including Cowlitz Valley Ranger District, Mount Adams Ranger District, and Mount St. Helens National Volcanic Monument and District. From the resort you can take the service road into the national forest.
